

2.1 Admission Committee

Admission committee has to provide syllabus for the entrance. CMAT (Common Management Admission test) presented in BBA & BHM syllabus is the approved format for the entrance as follows:

2.2 Eligibility for Admission

Following are the eligibility criteria for admission in BBA and BHM program:

- a. Completion of +2 level of education in any discipline with at least 2.00 CGPA in aggregate of grading system, or having at least 45% aggregate in percentage based evaluation system. Passed in MUSOM CMAT: MUSOM CMAT (Common Management Admission Test) follows the standardized format that consists of six key sections with the purpose of testing candidates' general knowledge, reasoning, verbal, analytical and communication skills.
- b. Candidates must score 40% (36 out of 90) in CMAT to be eligible for an interview and candidates must score 40% out of full marks to be eligible for the admission.

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4. Details for Entrance Exam

A separate question paper along with answer sheet should be provide to each applicant in stitched envelope.

Candidates should read instructions include in question paper before answering. Ink color used by candidates should be the same."

4.1 BBA Admission Procedure

Eligibility:

Students from any stream who have completed Grade 12 or equivalent level with a minimum of Grade "C" and d+ in one subject either in 11 or 12 or 50% overall aggregate score may apply for the program. But for BHM students must score d+ in each subject of 11 and 12 class. Students who have successfully completed Grade 11 (with 50% or above) and are awaiting Grade 12 results may apply for admission on provisional basis.

4.2 MUSOM Admission Arrangements

Departments have to manage two types of admission as follows:

- Regular admission
- Full Payment admission

4.3 Entrance Exam

- With collaboration of the office of the director BBA and BHM entrance exam would be conducted.
- Entrance exam would be conducted as peer specified date.
- Total marks of the entrance exam would be 100%.
- Only candidates having success in entrance exam with qualifying process is qualified for application.
- 100% entrance exam would be conducted as under:
- 90% entrance should be conducted in one shift covering 2 hours.
- It is necessary to bring an entrance card with clear passport size photo to appear in the exam.
 Without entrance card no applicant would be allowed to appear in the entrance exam.

4.4 Entrance Exam Admit Card Distribution

MUSOM administration would be responsible to provide entrance card to each student before entering exam hall. Without admit card no applicant can sit in the exam.

4.5 Publication Entrance Exam Result

Total marks in percent scored by candidates through entrance exam evaluation would be entrance exam percent. On the basis of marks in percent, candidates having scored 40% and above 40% (forty percent) as per MUSOM entrance pass cut off point can go for final admission in the program at MUSOM.

4.6 Selection and Publication of merit List

Total marks in percent scored by candidates through entrance exam evaluation would be entrance exam percent. Accordingly, as per percent received by the applicants the list of qualified candidates would be published. Only candidates having scored 40% and above would be included in the merit list.

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4.7 School Admission List publication and Admission Procedure

- If quotas remain unfulfilled at MUSO Part to be completed by allowing candidates with common qualification.
- If candidate is absent for one week without any notification from the date class commencement, such candidate's admission would be rejected.

4.8 Scholarship Scheme

As mentioned in MUSOM Academic Development and Implementation Guidelines 2021, 20 percent Students among total admitted students would receive grants only in tuition fee and management council is responsible to make decision final decision of any scholarship such as need based scholarship.

5. Sponsorship

MUSOM also accepts scholarship sponsored by private and government or foreign agencies. Foreign Students and NRN

If foreign applicants show interest in BBA and BHM program MUSOM can offer them 3 quotas on the condition of bot full paying and scholarship.

If any applicant does not apply, quotas would go with school's normal admission.

6. Required Documents

An applicant must complete the application form with copies of the following documents:

- Transcripts and certificates of Grade 12 or equivalent examinations
- Certificate and transcript of Grade 10 (SLC or equivalent)
- Character certificate (SLC and Grade 12)
- Provisional certificate
- Migration certificate
- Citizenship certificate
- Passport should be submitted by foreign students

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7. Cancelling Admission and Deposit Return

- Admission of students is to be chicalled when they fail to provide eligible documents as per university policy and regulations.
- If a student goes on leave for one week from class commencement date without any notice to department, admission is to be cancelled.
- If a student himself and herself cancels his/her admission before class commencement due any reason MUSOM is to return fee by having 10 % tuition fee and if after class commencement MUSOM is to return fee by having 20% tuition fee.
- If students leave school during academic year, he/she cannot receive any return of fee and deposit.
- If students leave and rejoin program due to any reason MUSOM should consult MU Exam Management Office and its policy and should treat students as per university regulations.




