The COVID-19 pandemic has challenged the Mid-West University School of Management (MUSOM) over the year, but MUSOM continued its academic activities successfully. This 3rd annual report will show the picture of how MUSOM maintained its academic calendar and accomplished notable achievements in terms of teaching, research, publication, and outreach program. 
